Welcome to our first newsletter! We are excited to represent you as the co-presidents of SCIRA. We hope to serve you well in the next two years.

Just to tell you a little bit about us...

Debbie Shefren—

I've been a teacher for over 35 years. I'm a reading specialist and currently working as an adjunct faculty member for National Louis University. I am also a Literacy Consultant and do training and staff development with teachers at various school districts.

Sarah Weisberg—

I have just started my 10th year as a teacher. I have taught in both inner city urban, and in suburban settings, working with children of a wide variety of ethnic and socio-economic backgrounds. I am currently a First Grade classroom teacher and loving every minute of it! I began my career in middle school special education. I have a reading specialist degree from Louis University and am currently working on my ELL degree from Northern Illinois University. Working with SCIRA is a passion of mine, because as we share expertise, all of our children and classrooms benefit.

We've had a wonderful beginning to our year with SCIRA's Summer Conference. We had 363 people attend! Doug Fisher was amazing and inspiring. He began our theme for this year: The Common Core and Close Reading.

Some of Doug Fisher's key points were:

- We must stretch young children's listening comprehension with more complex text.
- Simply assigning hard books will not ensure that students will learn at high levels.

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- Close Reading is ONE thing we do a couple times a week. It's guided instruction.
- Ask children, "What are you learning today?" not "What are you doing?"
- Reading volume matters so students need to read more at home in order to read more words.
- Close Reading is slowing down and going deep.
- Don't pre-teach vocabulary—give students time to figure out new words.
- Questions drive Close Reading
- Teach students to annotate text—annotation is a note of any form made while reading text.
- We must have collaborative conversations.
- We need to figure out the complexity factors of books.

Doug Fisher gave us so much to think about and plan to use in our classrooms.

Book Discussion Group

We've decided to do something new! We're going to have a book discussion group to talk about our speaker's book a couple of weeks after his/her presentation. Several people expressed the desire to read and discuss our speakers' books. This year we've arranged just that. See our attached flyers for more information!

Fall Conference

To continue our theme on the Common Core Standards and Close Reading we have the wonderful **Sunday Cummins** coming to speak to us on October 23, 2013. Dr. Cummins is a literacy consultant, author, and researcher with a focus on reading and writing informational texts. See attached flyer for more information. SCIRA will then hold a Book Discussion Group to discuss her book, *Close Reading of Informational Text*, on Monday, Nov. 4th at 4:30-5:30 at the Skokie Public Library.

Winter Conference

We're very pleased to announce that we have **Dr. Timothy Shanahan** coming to speak to us on January 31, 2014. He will continue to speak on our theme. Dr. Shanahan has authored or edited more than 150 publications including the books, Developing Literacy in Second-Language Learners, Teachers Thinking—Teachers Knowing, Multidisciplinary Perspectives on Literacy, Reading and Writing Together, and Understanding Research in Reading and Writing. Tim Shanahan's research emphasizes reading-writing relationships, reading assessment, and improving reading achievement, and he is frequently quoted in media outlets such as the New York Times, Washington Post, and Newsweek, and has appeared on Bloomberg News and the O'Reilly Factor. SCIRA will hold a Book Discussion group to discuss his latest book. Details will be announced.

Summer Conference

Our summer conference next year will be in two parts. Part 1 will be an exciting conclusion to this year's theme with our amazing speaker: **Dr. Ellin Oliver Keene**. She will be discussing the Common Core Standards, comprehension and fiction.

Part two, on the second day, will feature **Dan Feigelson.** Dan Feigelson will be introducing our theme for the 2014-15 school year: Writing and the Common Core Standards. Dan is one of the original members of Lucy Calkins' Teachers College Writing Project. Dan is the author of, *Practical Punctuation*.

How lucky we are to (finally) have an intellectually engaging exploration of what we have too long considered drudgery.... 

Sunday Cummins is a literacy consultant and a facilitator on the New Schools Project for the Erikson Institute. She has a Doctorate of Philosophy from the University of Illinois at Champaign-Urbana and a Master of Arts degree from Teachers College, Columbia University in Curriculum and Instruction. She taught at National Louis University from 2007-2012 in the Reading Program and she worked in public schools for ten years prior to that as a middle school and third grade classroom teacher and as a literacy coach.

Her book, *Close Reading of Informational Text: Assessment-Driven Instruction in Grades 3-8*, published by Guilford Press is available on Amazon.com.

She continues to teach and learn alongside educators and students as a literacy consultant, author, and researcher with a focus on reading and writing informational texts. She shares her work on the power of teaching with nonfiction texts to transform students' thinking by presenting at state, national, and international conferences. She has published articles in *The Reading Teacher*, *Book Links, Journal of Adolescent & Adult Literacy Talking Points*.

Turn right onto Moon Hill Drive which then turns into Shabonee Trail.

Approaching Shabonee School turn *right* and park *behind* Shabonee School. Use Entrance C for entry into the building.

OR

Approaching Shabonee School turn *left* and park along Shabonee Trail. Use Entrance P for entry into the building.
